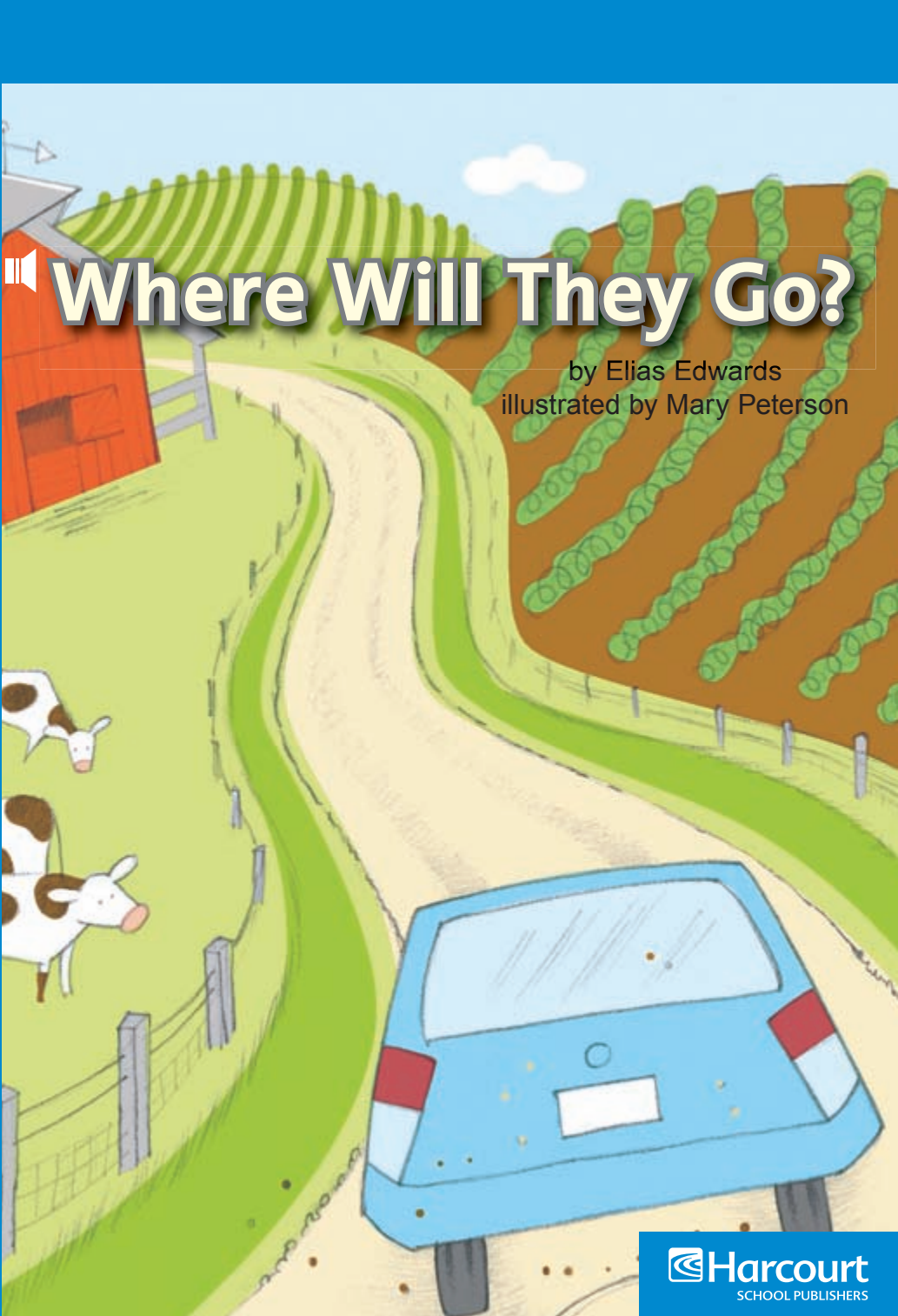




Where Will They Go?
