

LISTENING SCRIPTS – SEMESTER 1 TEST

Narrator: Look at Part 1.

Listen and put a tick or a cross in the box.

There are two examples.

Example A.

B: This is my mother.

G: This is your mother? OK.

Narrator: Example B.

G: This is a monkey.

B: A monkey? OK. I see.

Narrator: Can you see the answers?

Now you listen and put a tick or a cross in the box.

One.

G: This is my brother.

B: Your brother? OK, I see.

Narrator: Two.

G: Look, Fred. It's a flower. It's red.

B: OK. Yes, it's a red flower.

Narrator: Three.

W: Touch your leg.

G: My leg? OK.

Narrator: Now, listen to Part 1 again.

(Repeat)

That is the end of Part 1.

Narrator: Part 2.

Listen and tick the box.

There is one example.

G: It's a pencil.

B: A pencil? Oh, yes.

Narrator: Can you see the tick?

Now you listen and tick the box.

Four.

B: This is a snake.

G: This is a snake? OK.

Narrator: Five.

G: I like dogs.

B: Dogs? Hmm. Yeah, I like dogs.

Narrator: Six.

B: Touch your arm.

G: Arm? OK, yes.

Narrator: Now, listen to Part 2 again.

(Repeat)

That is the end of Part 2.

Narrator: Part 3.

Listen and tick the box. There is one example.

B: Look, Vicky. A flower!

G: Yes, it's white. It's a white flower.

Narrator: Can you see the tick?

Now you listen and tick the box.

Seven.

G: Here. It's a pencil.

B: A pencil? OK, thanks.

Narrator: Eight.

B: Look. It's blue.

G: Yes, it is blue. It's a blue flower.

Narrator: Nine.

G: Touch your head.

B: My head? OK.

Narrator: Now, listen to Part 3 again.

(Repeat)

That is the end of Part 3.

Narrator: Part 4.

Listen and draw lines. There is one example.

B: Look. A flower! It's yellow.

G: Yes, Charlie. It's a yellow flower.

Narrator: Can you see the line?

Now you listen and draw lines.

Ten.

G: I like cats.

B: Cats? Hmm. Yes, I like cats, Zoe.

Narrator: Eleven.

B: It's a bag.

G: A bag? Yes, it is, Fred.

Narrator: Twelve.

G: This is my father.

B: Your father, Sally? OK.

Narrator: Now, listen to Part 4 again.

(Repeat)

That is the end of the Listening test.
