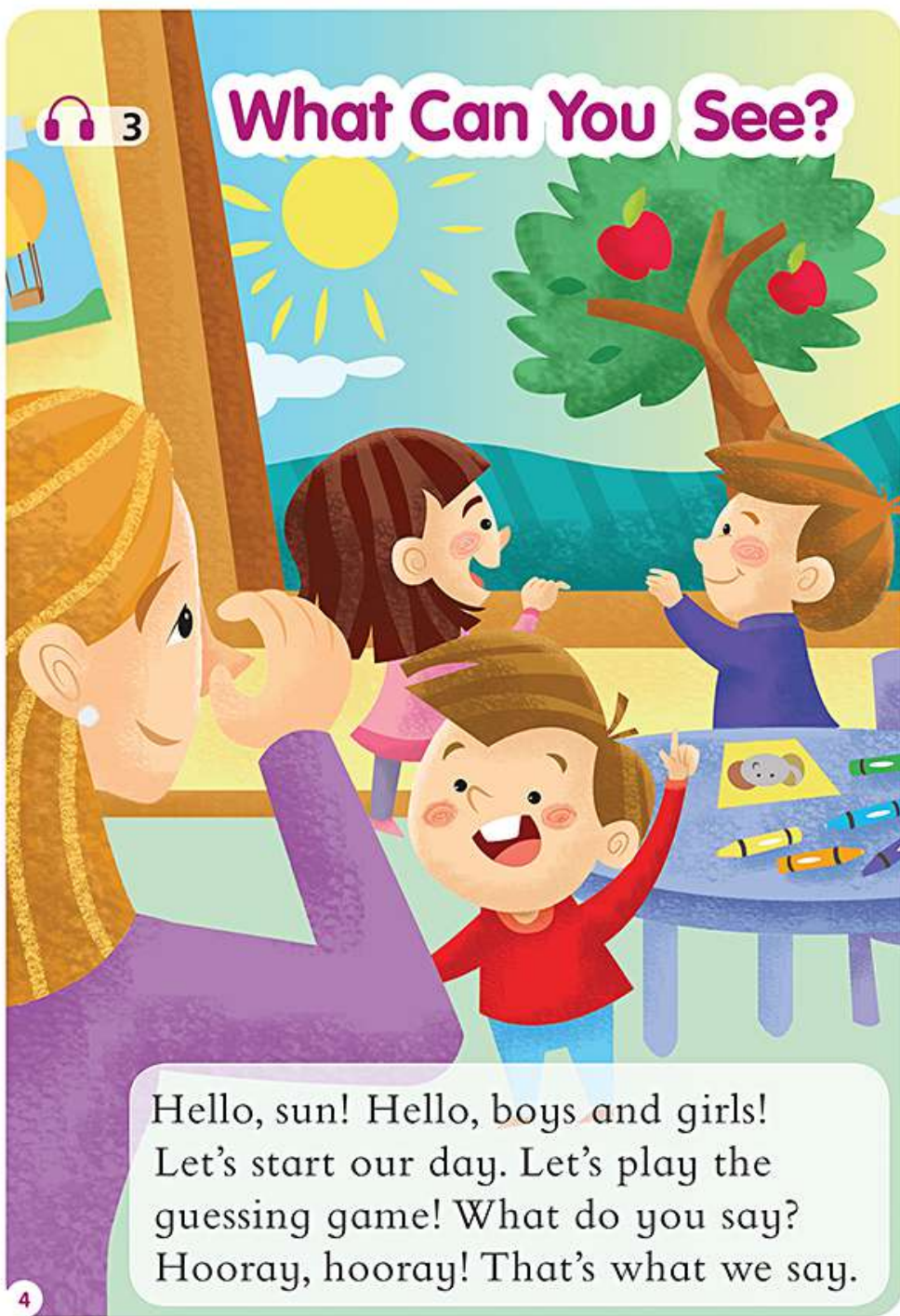




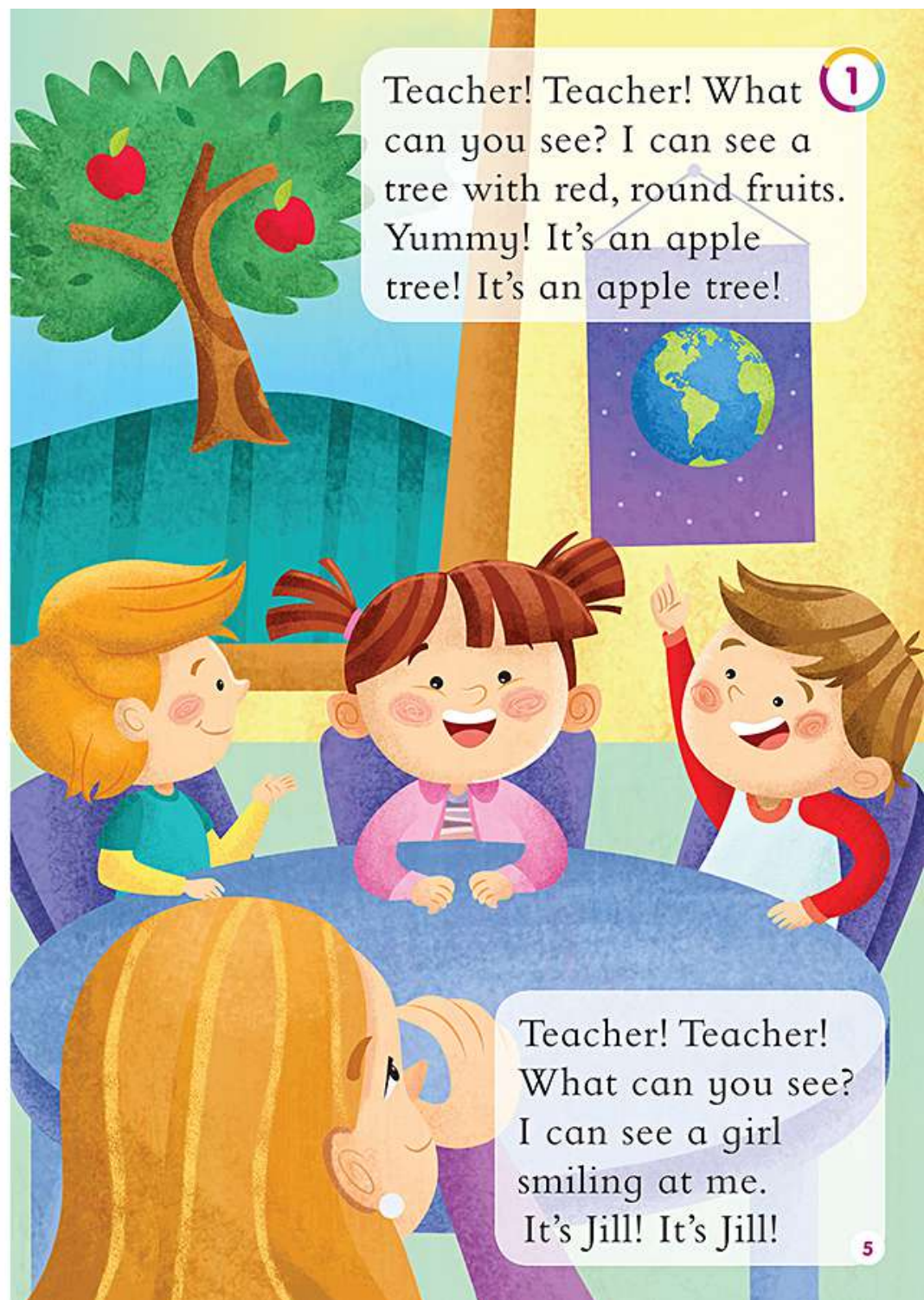
What Can You See?

tree! It's an apple tree!

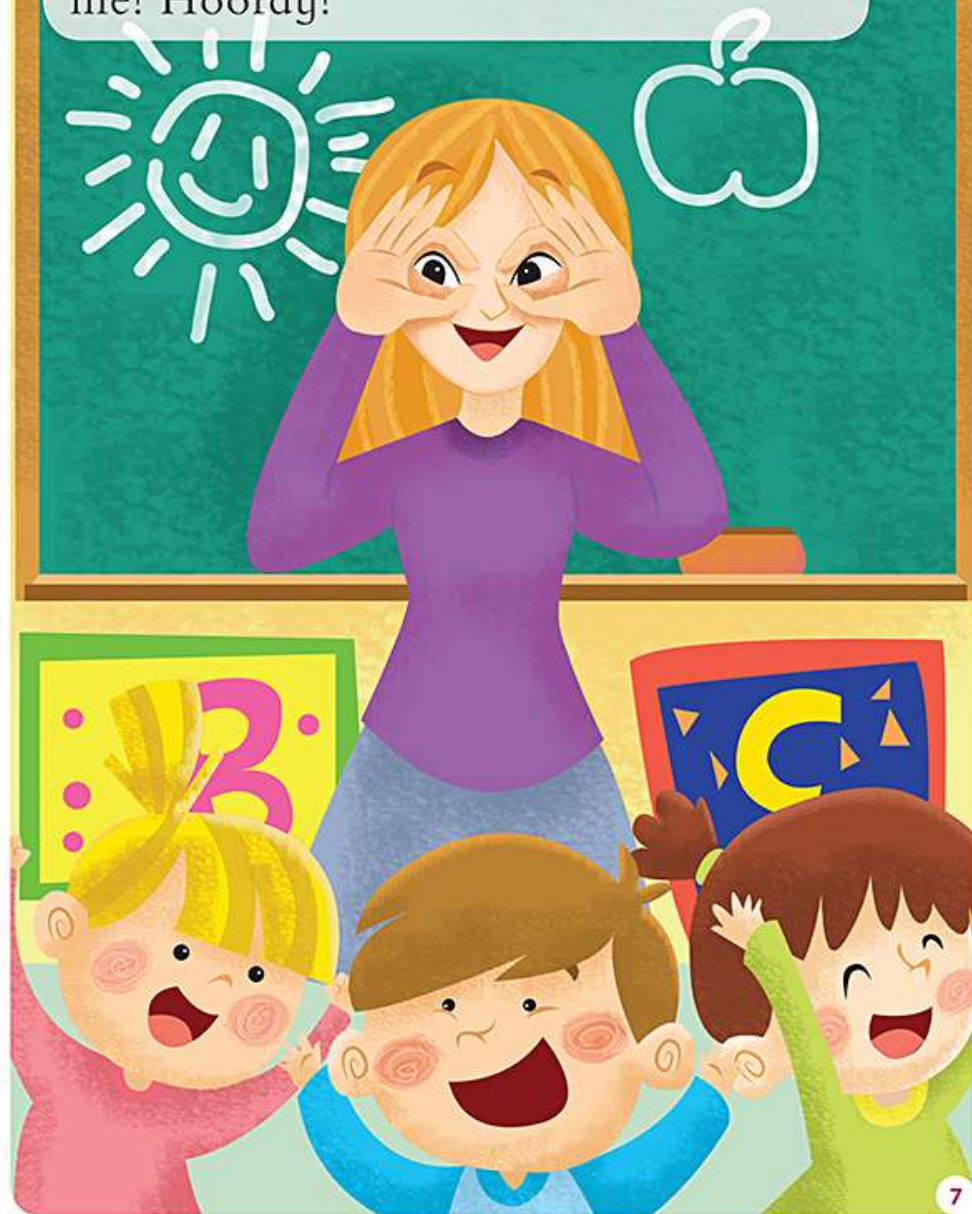


Teacher! Teacher!

Teacher! Teacher! What can you see? I can see some children playing with me! Hooray!



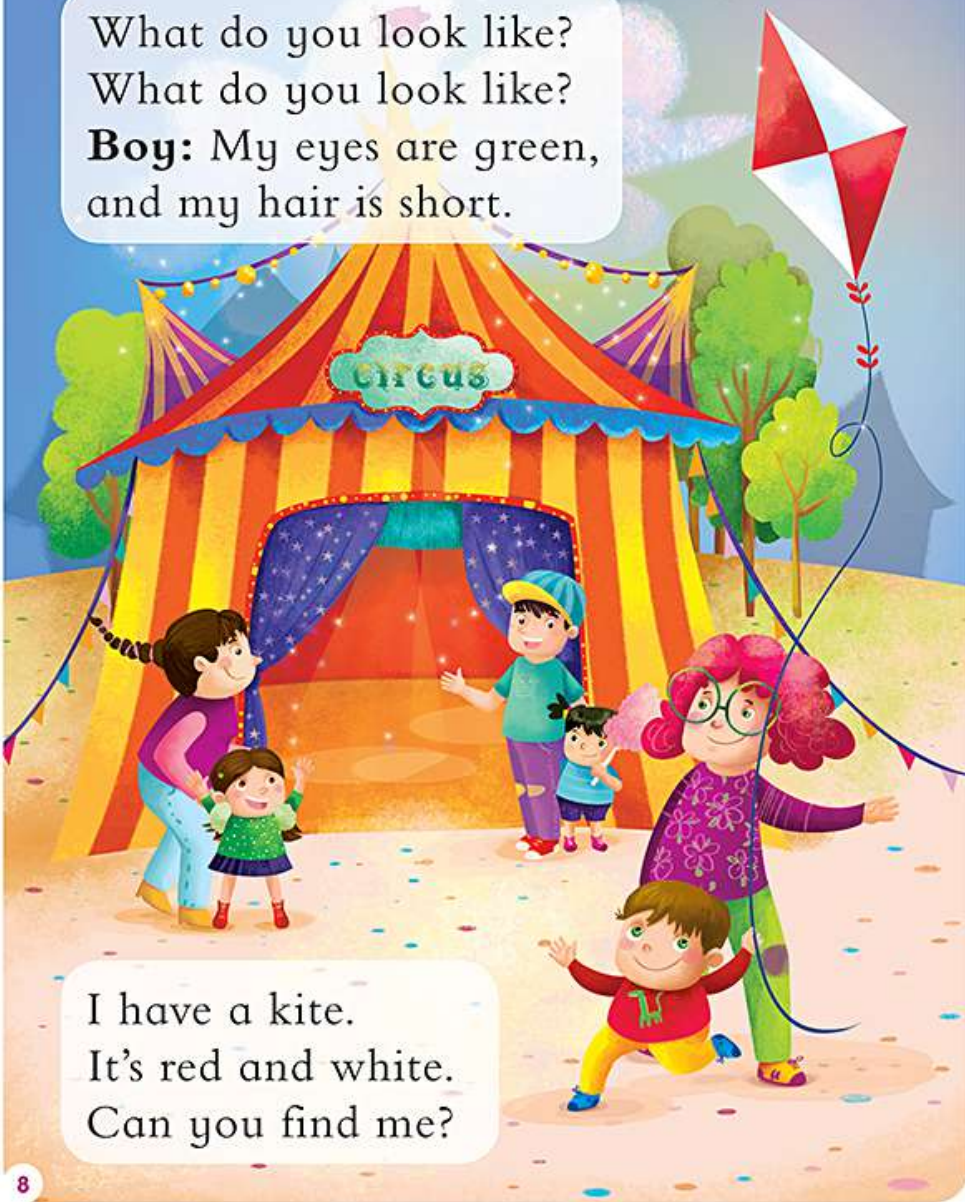

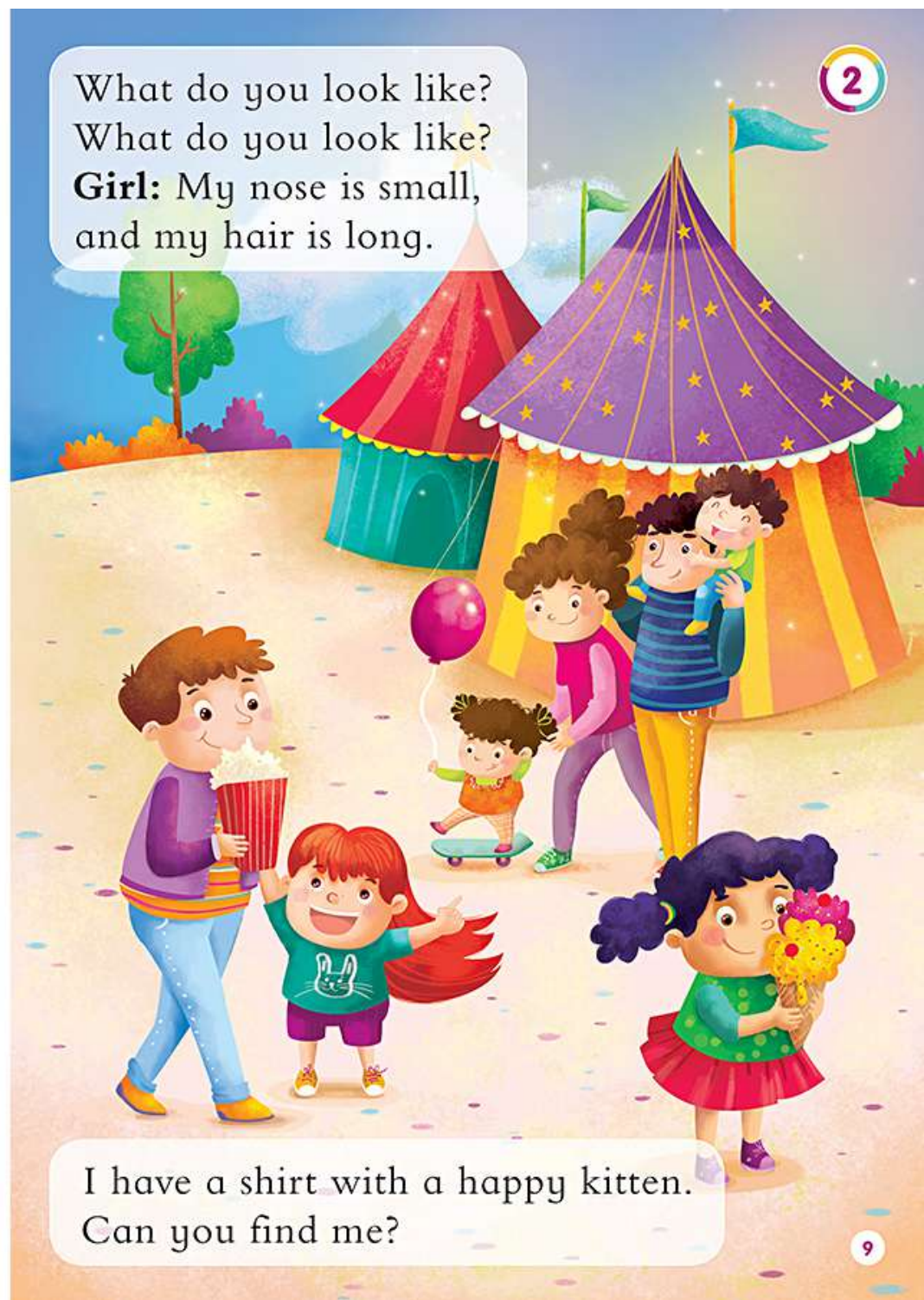

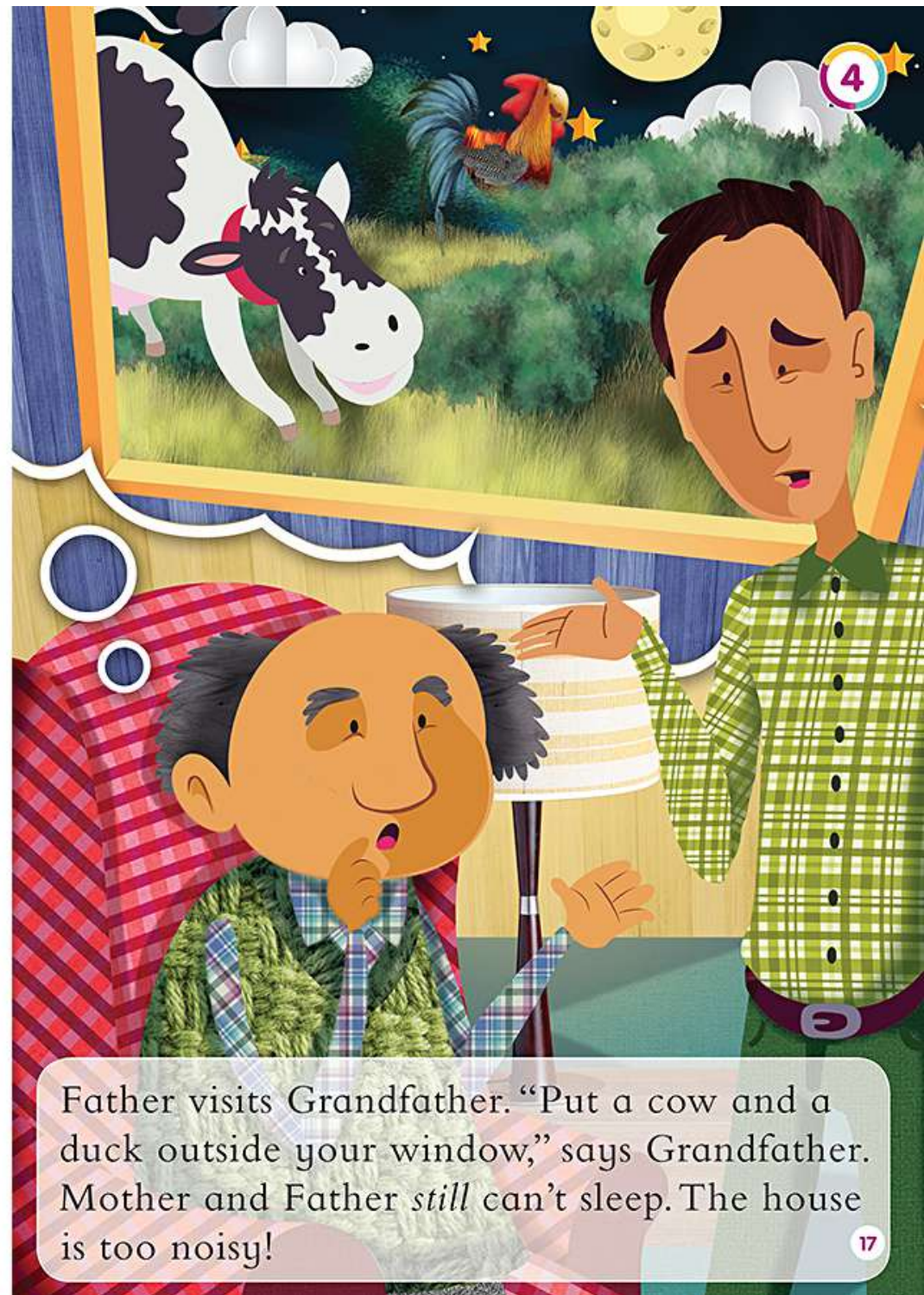
The Noisy House

The house is too noisy!



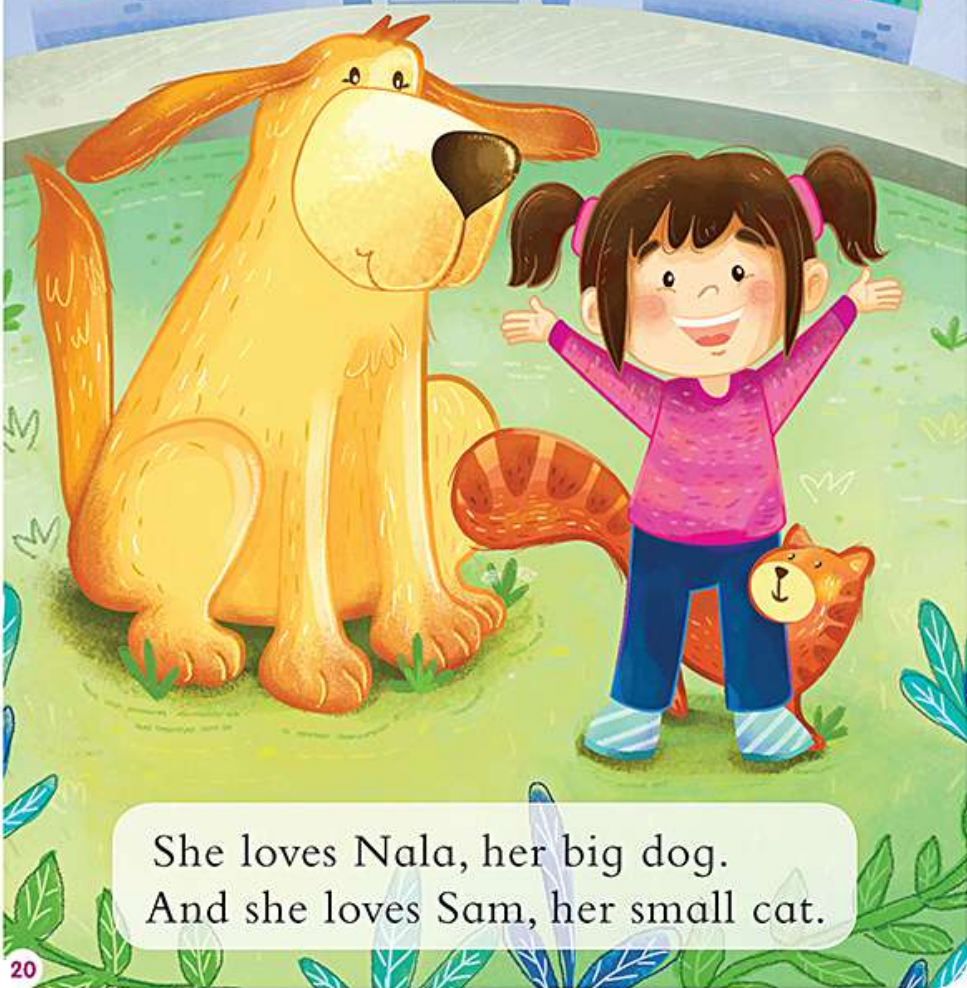
Father goes back to Grandfather. “Put

Nala runs and chases Sam.



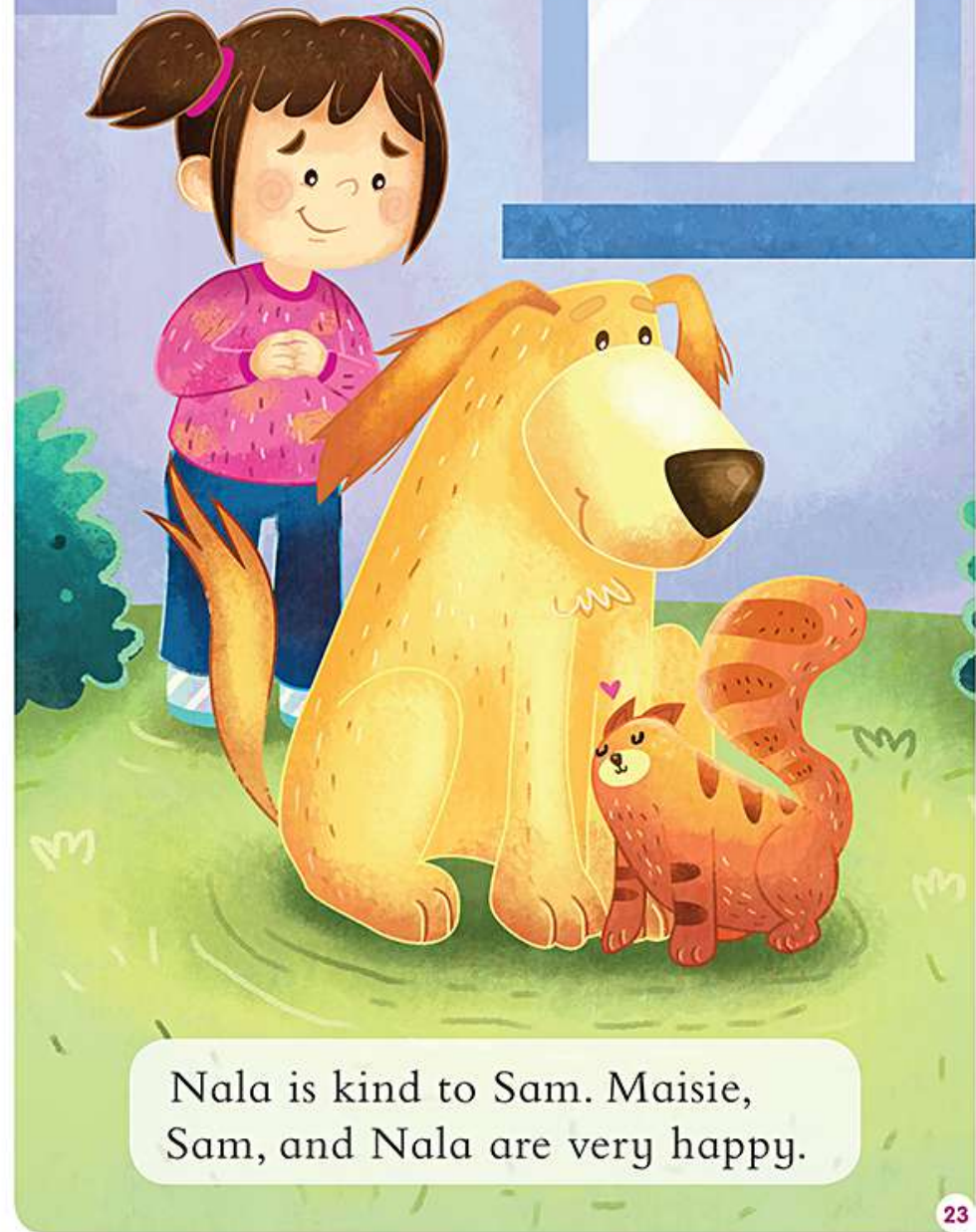
Nala says, "Woof, woof!" Sam says,

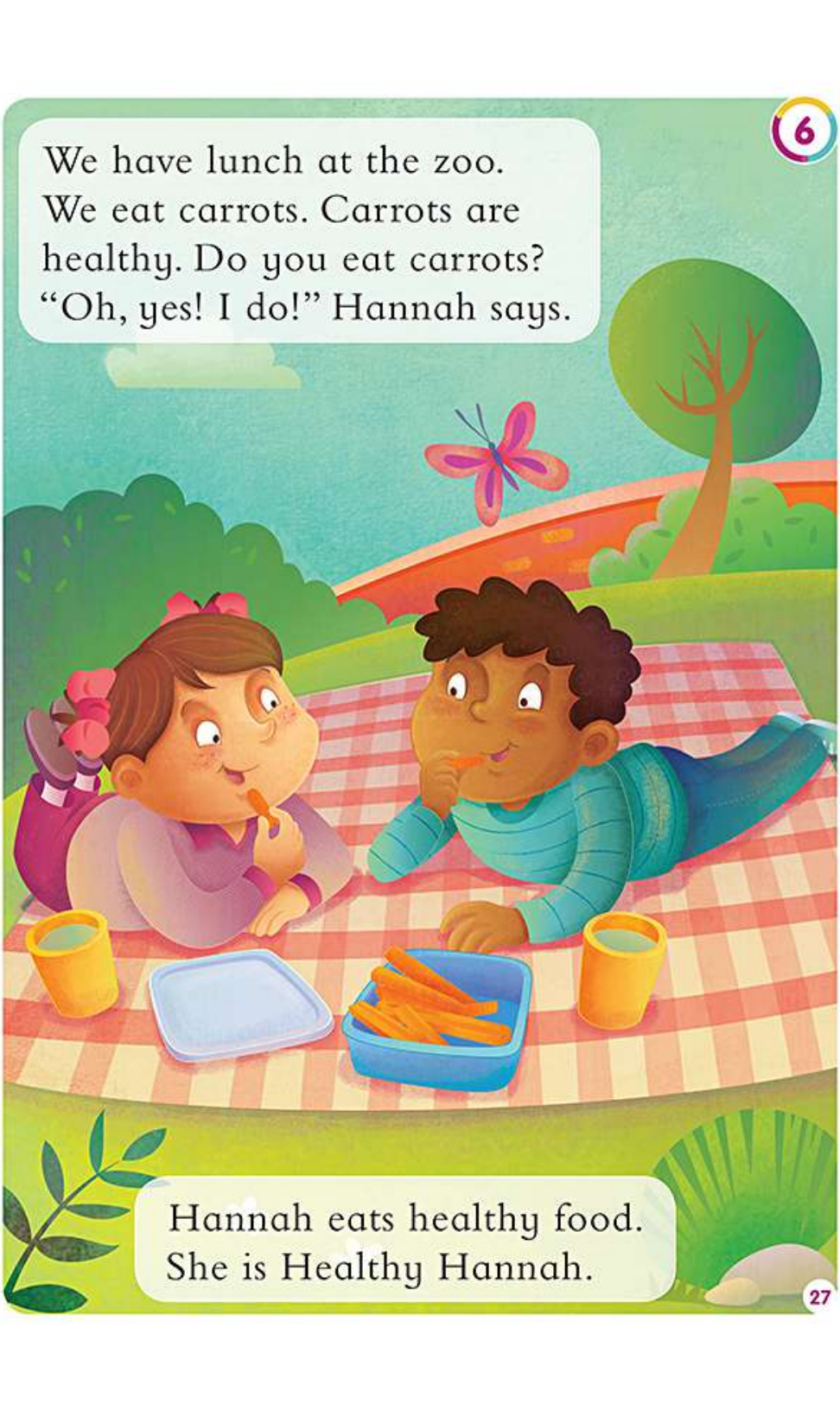

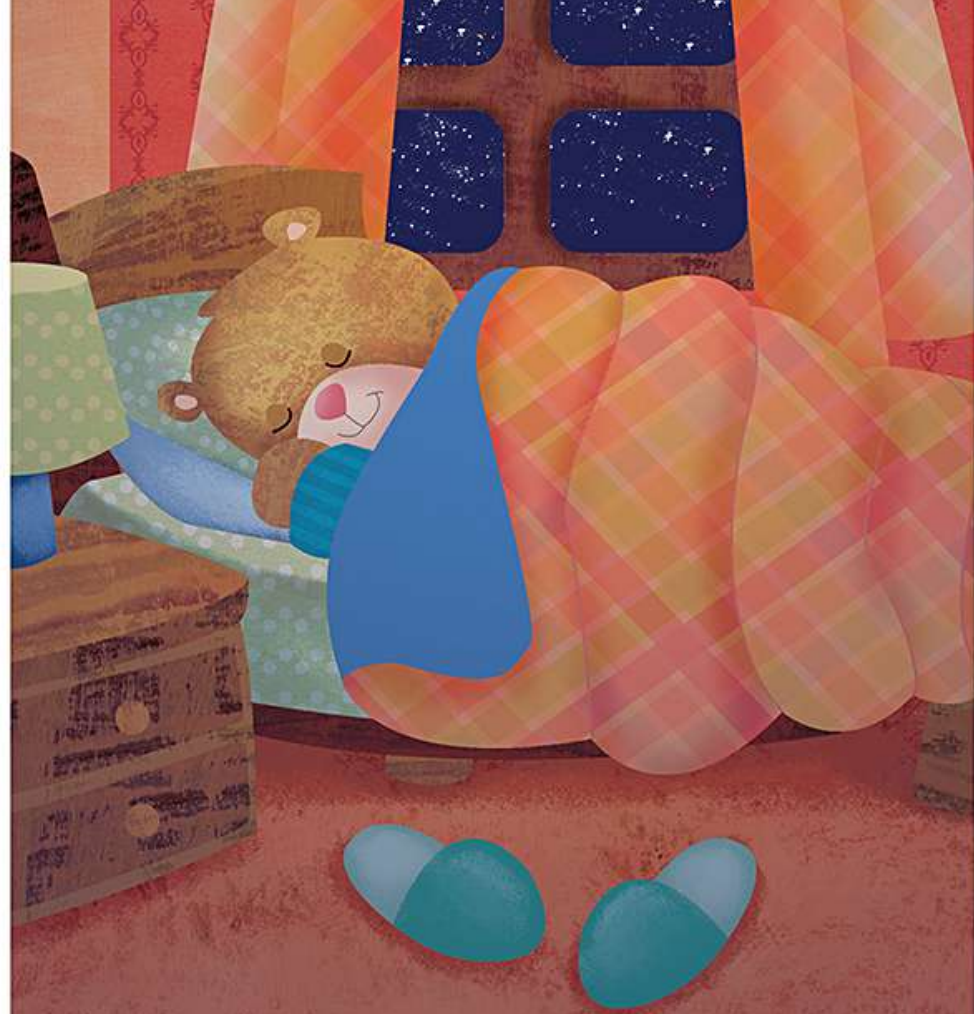

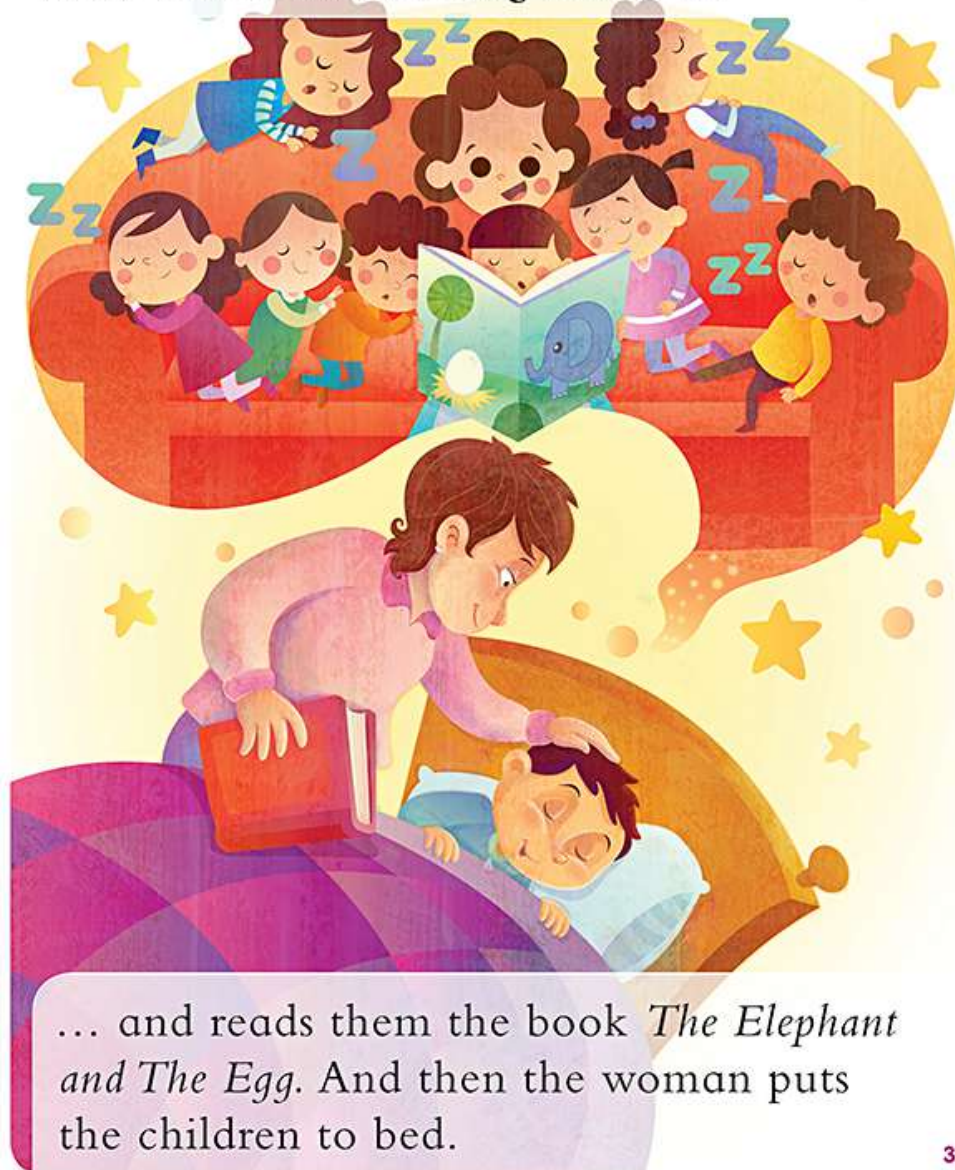
