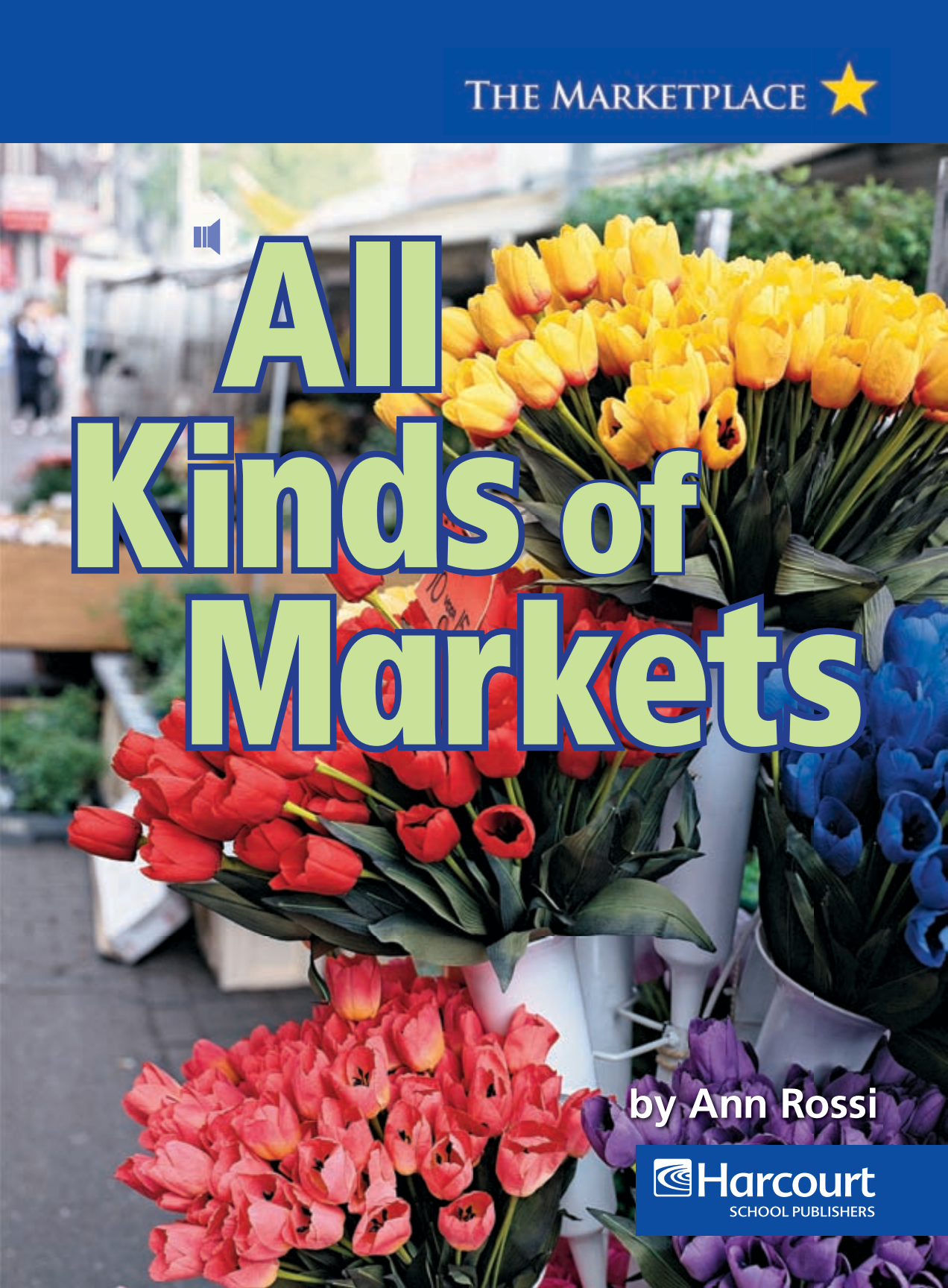

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Markets in North America

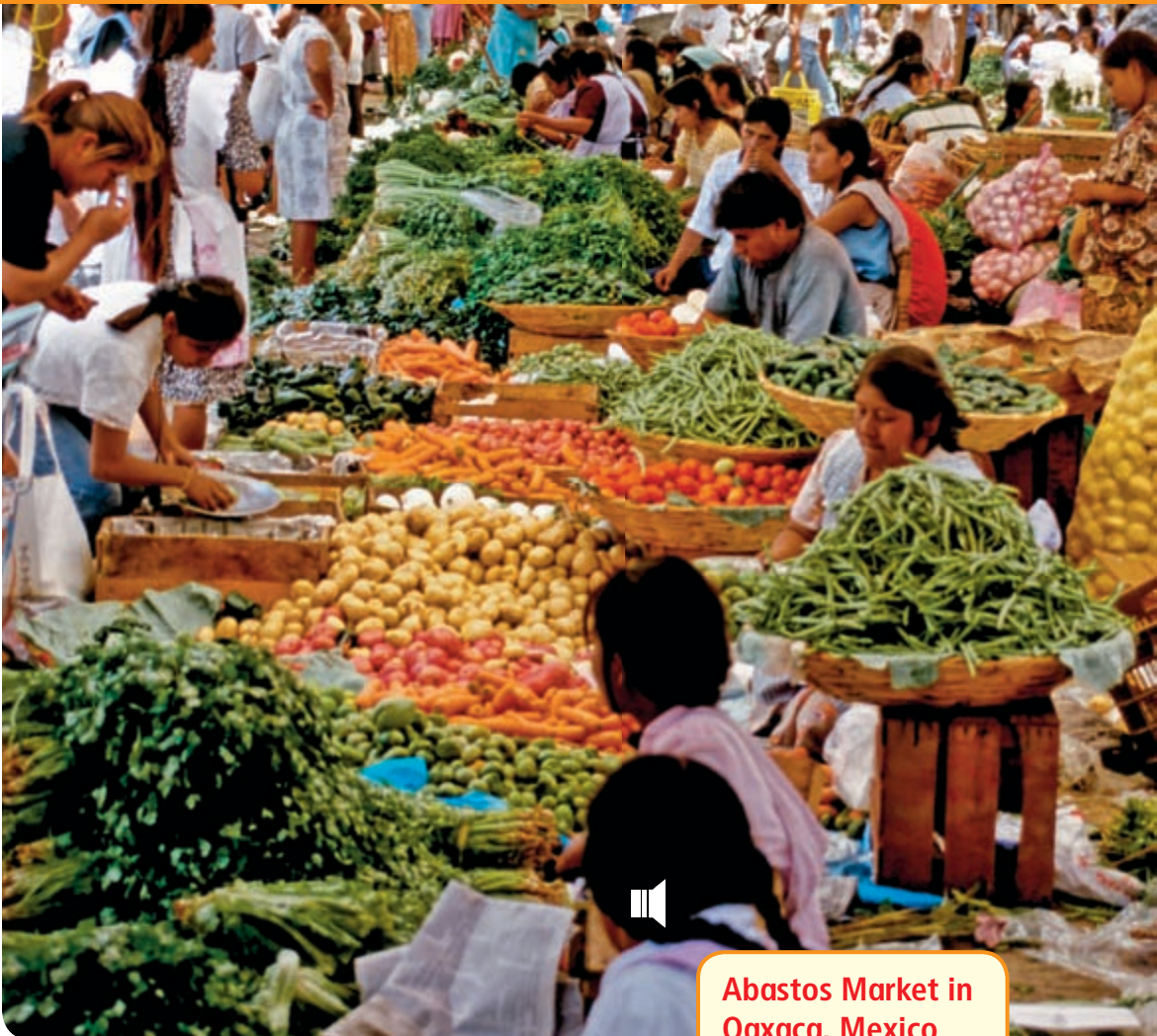


Pike Place Market began as a market where farmers sold foods they grew. Farmers still sell fresh foods there. Now people also sell fish and other goods.

in Amsterdam**

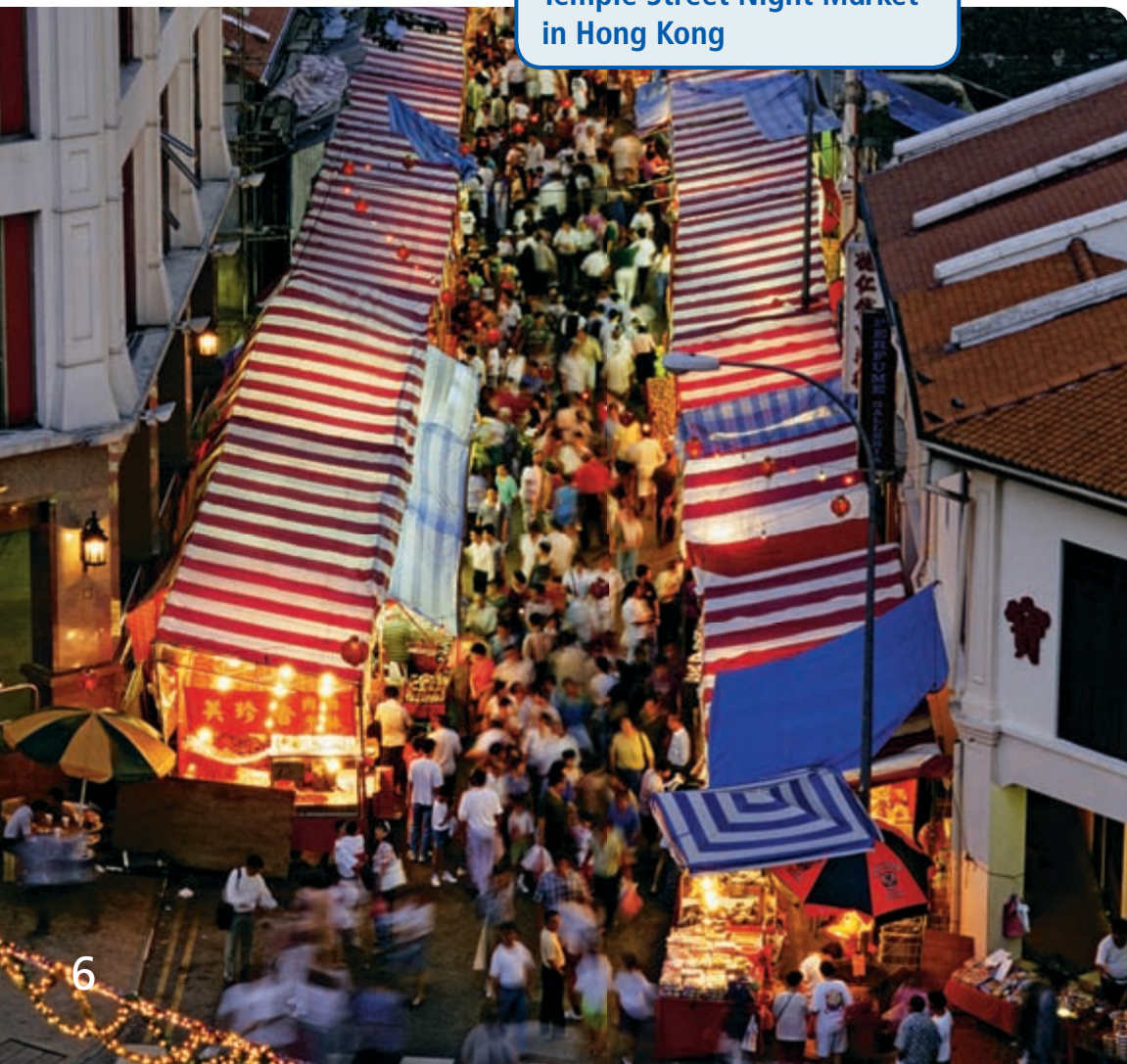
Amsterdam has a flower market on water. The flowers are on boats. People go onto the boats to buy the flowers.
